How to improve the ornate of the community

The ornate of the community can be expressed on the walls of the school, the by the beauty of the temple or chapel, by the streets, and by the presence of many trees and flowers. Cleanliness and the marking of streets with street signs also express the ornate.

It is good to keep animals out of the streets and squares, to keep these clean. All of these measures will make it a pleasure to live in the community, and a place to be proud of. The roads, which lead to the communities, should be clearly marked to prevent visitors from losing their way.

An adequate location should be created for solid waste such as plastic, cans and other non-organic materials. Used batteries should be given or sold to recyclers. This includes the batteries f vehicles and small batteries from radios, torches, watches, cellphones etc. The materials of these batteries are very toxic and dangerous. Therefore, it is important to collect them and to dispose of them in an adequate manner.

How to promote the arts and culture of the community

The paintings, colours, symbols and textiles with typical designs of our ancestors are part of our identity and have much value. This also includes the dancing, music, clothing, storytelling, songs, a beautiful pincullo (Andean flute) you hear at dawn... all these things... Our culture also includes Quechua, our beautiful and noble language.

The Board of Juries

Each community, town or annex shall designate two jury members; two women or one man and one woman (At least one must be literate). The jury members will maintain contact with the organizers of the contest, participate in study tours and will guide their community or annex. Moreover, the jury members can become part of the Qualifying Jury in other communities.

- The Board of Juries (President, Secretary, Treasurer, Vocals) will be elected by the General Assembly of all jury members from all communities.
- The Board of Juries will organize the grading of the families and communities. The grades obtained are final and cannot be appealed.
- The Board of Juries can declare some prizes void, if none of the communities acquires at least 50% of the maximum score.

The Qualifying Jury

The Qualifying Jury will grade the communities according to the criteria and grades listed in this brochure.



Watch out!!

The Qualifying Jury can disqualify a community for the following reasons:

- For presenting false information
- For having **more than one family** which is not sending its children (girls or boys) to primary or secondary school
- For having one or more elderly persons or disabled person living in misery and desolation
- For having more than 4 families without a latrine or bathroom
- For having more than 4 families without an improved kitchen with a chimney
- For allowing the sale and consumption of alcohol within the community
- For allowing free grazing in more than 20% of the total communal areas.
- Having dirty water coming from bathrooms with an hydraulic system, in any part of the community
- For having less than 15 families participating in the contest (those families can inscribe with a neighbouring community).
- For other serious shortcomings, if the Qualifying Jury so decides.



ABOUT THE RESULTS

The Qualifying Jury will inform the participants about the results immediately once the process of grading has been completed. The Qualifying Jury will carry out the grading and declare the winners. The results will be registered in the Minutes of the Board of Juries, which must be signed by all Qualifying Jury members.

The Chairman of the Board of Juries will announce publicly which are the winning communities and winning families within a maximum of four days after completion of the grading process. In addition, the Chairman shall inform in writing to the Mayor of the District and the Coordinator of Pachamama Raymi.

ABOUT THE AWARD CEREMONY

The award winning ceremony will be held in the community which has obtained first place or in a place chosen by the Board of Juries. The Jury will inform the Mayor of the District about the date, place and other details of the award winning ceremony. The ceremony may include traditional ceremonies in honour of Mother Earth.

The award winning ceremony will be organized by the Board of Juries.

The Board of Jurors may invite District authorities, public officials and other authorities to enhance the award winning ceremony.

The job of the Health Volunteer is one of great responsibility because it is key to the good health of all people in the community.

The work often implies great sacrifices on the part of the promotor, but is also very gratifying and of great importance to everyone.

Registers

It is necessary to keep registers of all activities carried out including the ones mentioned above (names and other details of the persons attended)

➤ **REGISTRY AND FOLLOW-UP OF PREGNANT WOMEN**

Pregnancy is a critical period in the life of the mother and the baby growing inside her. Special care and monitoring is needed at all stages. That is why the job of the Health Promotor is very important to pregnant women, to make sure they go to all pre-natal check-ups at the Health Center. Mothers should go to the Health Center to give birth, to avoid serious problems that may occur during the giving of labour.

➤ **REGISTRY OF VACCINATIONS**

Preventing is better than curing. Vaccines can prevent many serious diseases. The Health Promotor should achieve that all residents of the community receive the adequate vaccinations according to their age.

➤ **HOME VISITS**

The Health Promotor must be familiar with common health problems.

The Health Promotor should know which families are at risk.

Therefore, the Health Promotor has to visit each family and understand the needs and health problems of each family, and if necessary, act effectively, probably referring the patient.

➤ **REGISTRATION AND FAMILY PLANNING COUNSELING**

Having many children decreases the quality of life.

Having many children increases the risks of health problems, poor nutrition, poor education and high poverty. In addition, every pregnancy and birth is a big risk for women.

The Health Volunteer must support families with adequate family planning. Everyone should understand the benefits of good family planning

➤ **A REGISTER, DETECTION AND REFERRING OF PATIENTS AND/OR PREGNANT WOMEN**

The Health Promotor must be prepared to detect dangerous diseases that compromise life.

The Health Promotor should also know which pregnant women do not attend their regular check-ups and which ones are already in labor.

If necessary, the Health Promotor should send the patient to the Health Center, or seek help.

➤ **FAMILY HYGIENE GUIDANCE**

The order, cleanliness of the body, hands, and hygiene is important to prevent many dangerous diseases in adults and children.

The Health Promotor must set an example of keeping order, cleanliness and hygiene in his/her own home.

In addition, the Health Promotor must provide guidance in these issues and explain the importance of cleansing the body, home, and environment to each family.

➤ **SUPPORT TO AND COORDINATION WITH HEALTH PROGRAMS**

Health Promoters help families and coordinate with the Health Center.

➤ **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FIRST AID KIT**

The Health Promotor should make sure a first aid kit is implemented, in order to have those tools available which may be needed in an emergency.

➤ **PARTICIPATION OF THE FAMILIES IN THE HEALTH PROGRAMS**

The Health Promotor must understand the problems of each family and guide them in a friendly manner to resolve these.

➤ **PARTICIPATION IN RELEVANT COURSES**

The Health Promotor is a leader in his community, a person who provides direction and guidance and who understands the problems of his/her community. Therefore, the Health Promotor needs to have the knowledge necessary to carry out this function well.

The Qualifying Jury will grade the Health Promoters by checking his/her registers and visits he/she made to the families, in coordination with the Health Center.

ABOUT THE JURY FOR HEALTH PROMOTORS

The Qualifying Jury of Health Promoters will consist of local representatives of organizations related to health services in the area.

The jury will qualify based on the criteria described in these Rules and Regulations.

Duties of the Jury

The Jury must grade the Health Promoters according to the criteria and scores indicated in this brochure. The grading by the jury is not appealable and shall not be subject to any claims.

The Jury may disqualify a Health Promotor for reasons such as:

- Not keeping registers of his/her patients
- Failure to comply with other requirements described in this brochure
- Falsifying data
- Other serious reasons



ABOUT THE RESULTS

In regards to the grading of the Health Promoters, the Jury will inform the participants about the results immediately once the process of evaluating has been completed. They will carry out the grading and declare the winning Promoters. The Jury will register the evaluations and results in the Minutes book of the Health Center, an annex of the Minutes of the Board of Juries.

The jury of the contest between Health Promoters will announce the winners in public, within two days after the process of evaluation has been completed. The municipality, Health Center and Pachamama Raymi will be informed in writing.

The work of the JASS Committees is fundamental because it helps to improve the health- and living conditions of the community. The job often requires sacrifices but is of great importance to everyone.



Responsibilities of a JASS Committee:

The members of the JASS Committee are leaders of their community. The committee consists of, directs and guides villagers of their community. Every Committee must keep A REGISTER of all the participants (names and surnames of the persons and families) and must carry out the following activities:

➤ MONITORING OF THE USE OF WATER

The JASS Committee must be prepared to detect inadequate use of water which compromises the health of the family. Due to the increasing consumption and bad use of drinking water, adequate monitoring by the JASS Committee is required. With the aim of promoting the correct use of water in the house, it must be achieved that the families assist in the capacitation and improve their practices in the use and consumption of drinking water.

➤ CHLORINATION OF THE DRINKING WATER

It is best to treat the water. Chlorination prevents many serious diseases. The JASS Committee must achieve the chlorination of all the drinking water in their community, according to a timetable. They must actively support the chlorination in coordination with the Health Center.

➤ HOUSE VISITS

The JASS Committee must understand the problems in the community. Therefore, the Committee must visit each family in the community, observe the problems related to health or sanitation, which occur regularly in the house, and if it is necessary, act up and correct these problems in an effective manner.



➤ **GUIDANCE IN THE USE OF LATRINES**

Not having a latrine or bathroom can result in health problems. Flies are able to thrive and increase the incidence of diseases. A latrine benefits the family. The Committee must support the families to plan the installation of, and to use latrines. All family members must use the latrines adequately at home, and understand their benefits.

➤ **GUIDANCE OF THE MONTHLY FEES FOR THE USE OF WATER**

The JASS Committee must keep a register of the fees of families are subscribed to the water service. The Committee calls upon the families to carry out maintenance activities and incentives them to pay in time for the consumption of water.

➤ **IMPLEMENTATION AND ORDERING OF THE MATERIALS**

The JASS Committee should take care of the implementation of the materials and tools necessary to support the families. The committee is responsible for the protection and organization of these materials.

➤ **PARTICIPATION OF THE FAMILIES IN THE MEETINGS AND ASSIGNMENTS OF JASS**

The JASS Committee organizes, convenes and registers the meetings and assignments of the participating families.

➤ **PARTICIPACION IN RELEVANT COURSES**

The JASS Committee must understand the problems of every family and guide the families in an efficient manner. Therefore, they need to attend courses of capacitation and acquire the knowledge necessary to be able to carry out this function well.



ABOUT THE JURY FOR THE JASS COMMITEES

The Qualifying Jury of Health Promoters will consist of local representatives of organizations related to health services in the area. The jury will qualify based on the criteria described in these Rules and Regulations.

The Qualifying Jury must begin with the verification of the registers of every JASS Committee. To this purpose, they will visit the registered families and persons in these registers, in coordination with the Health Center.

Duties of the Jury

The Jury must grade the JASS Committees according to the criteria and scores indicated in this brochure. The grading by the jury is not appealable and shall not be subject to any claims.

The Jury may disqualify a Health Promotor for reasons such as:

- Not keeping registers of users.
- Failure to comply with other requirements described in this brochure
- Falsifying data
- Other serious reasons



DO NOT BURN PLASTIC!

Burning plastic is a threat to health and the environment. The smoke which you inheal CAUSES PULMONARY CANCER, results in respiratory problems, affects the nerve system, causes headaches etc. The plastic contains toxins which the human body cannot break down. Pregnant women pass on these toxins to their babies via the placenta. The toxins (dioxins) stay in the planting soil: they can end up in the water and in our food.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

Avoid the burning of plastics, synthetic material or rubber. Reduce the purchasing of products with plastic packagins or reuse these materials in one of many creative manners. Seperate the plastic in an adequate location and come to an agreement with your authorities, neighbours and the institutions which work in your district to find the best final destination for these materials.
